### **Networks report:**

• Selena and Andrea attended, and were asked to discuss and bring back feedback on the new calendar, reports cards and the potential for grade configuration.

#### Calendar:

- A Kindergarten parent expressed they would prefer no Fridays
- Some agreed that they like that the public and catholic district had most of the same days off
- Educators feel there is no difference in kids from a teaching perspective with now full
   Fridays
- Calendar is always available to parents via website/weekly beacon, so no confusion about days off/on, and teachers always remind parents/students

#### Report cards:

- Most liked the 1-4 way of reporting
- Wording and format still needs some work to make it parent friendly, although much more parent friendly than previous
- Easy to read and understand, but it lacks the personal touch, in terms of comments from the teachers
- The report cards made it clear as to where the student needs improvement but not clear on where they excelled

- Doug Nicholls was happy to hear the feedback about the report cards and was glad it was better received than last years, appreciates the feedback
- Grade Configuration (Taking grades 7-8 out of Elementary)
  - o This will be a board level decision but want to hear how people feel about
  - Discussion has been happening for a while, Catholic switched years back but the Public district had not been interested in the switch at that time
  - -Ecole MacTavish has been approved to be a Grade 7-12 school in 2017 and will bring enrollment concerns to schools north
  - There have been some families that have switched to the catholic board because of 7-8 being moved out, no proof but the numbers suggest that according to the board
  - o The Public board will be looking into this in January
  - The board would like to have input from councils and parents
  - This would be done in a gradual process and according to the guidelines from Alberta education
  - Composite High school has 25 million in moderation, and the current enrollment is low, so adding grades 7 and 8 makes sense

## **Teacher Report: Shelley Kellington:**

- Mrs. Kellington took a course in Edmonton, ColarMix was an app that was shown and discussed at the course, Mrs. Kellington showed the way it works and how it is a great tool for teaching
- Telegrami was another app that was presented and it is something the students can use to make
  presentations, these apps were an example of how we need to move forward with technology
  and teaching the students new things, but creating a balance as well
- There were some talks about Teacher requests but none had been sent across by the time of the meeting.
